## Collect for Christ the King



God the Father, help us to hear the call of Christ the King and to follow in his service, whose kingdom has no end; for he reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, one glory. **Amen** 

### Bible reading: Luke 23: 33-43

When they came to the place that is called The Skull, they crucified Jesus there with the criminals, one on his right and one on his left. Then Jesus said, 'Father, forgive them; for they do not know what they are doing.' And they cast lots to divide his clothing. And the people stood by, watching; but the leaders scoffed at him, saying, 'He saved others; let him save himself if he is the Messiah of God, his chosen one!' The soldiers also mocked him, coming up and offering him sour wine, and saying, 'If you are the King of the Jews, save yourself!' There was also an inscription over him, 'This is the King of the Jews.'

One of the criminals who were hanged there kept deriding him and saying, 'Are you not the Messiah? Save yourself and us!' But the other rebuked him, saying, 'Do you not fear God, since you are under the same sentence of condemnation? And we indeed have been condemned justly, for we are getting what we deserve for our deeds, but this man has done nothing wrong.' Then he said, 'Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom.' He replied, 'Truly I tell you, today you will be with me in Paradise.'

<u>Reflection</u> Today we celebrate the Feast of Christ the King, marking the end of another Church year, as next Sunday is Advent Sunday. The gospel today highlights the difference between an earthly king and Jesus, King of heaven, who went willingly to the cross to die for us, so that we might have eternal life through him. Most kings would expect their subjects to be willing to die in their defence instead! Jesus is mocked by all around him, the soldiers gambling for his clothing as he hangs on the cross between two criminals, one of whom joins in with the taunting of

Jesus. But the other recognises how Jesus is different, doesn't, like them, deserve

his punishment and is rewarded by the promise of eternal life. In his agony, Jesus prays for forgiveness for those who put him to death, recognising their ignorance of who he is, what they are doing. As he said to Pilate, his kingdom is not of this world. As Christians, we too are 'not of this world' although living in it. Our eyes should be fixed on Jesus our King as we follow his teaching, encouraged by his example of self-giving, his courage as his earthly life ended and confident of his victory over death.
