Since last time we have installed further sound deadening panels in Chanctonbury to great effect – they do the same job as those dark blue curtains but rather more effectively and much more neatly! We think we are there as far as echo/reverberation in the individual halls is concerned but we need to wait and see as far as noise transmission between the halls is concerned. Whilst significantly improved, it may not be as good as we would like. If so, this will be a more difficult issue. As a further acoustic improvement, for film night, we have now modified the system so that the sound no longer goes through separate speakers but uses the hall's own sound system - which means that the hearing loop works. We tried it last time and it was generally regarded as an improvement all round.

The floor is still drying out – we hope warmer weather will help and we believe it will be ready for the work to start within the next month, two at worst. However, because this will mean that Chanctonbury will need to close for around a week, we are trying to synchronise the work with major repair to the floors in the ladies and disabled toilets – hirers may have noticed how soft and springy these have become.... The work will require stripping the vinyl flooring, removing the wooden floor and battens, concrete screeding and replacement vinyl.

As mentioned (prematurely!!) in an earlier article, many of the volunteers who have independently arranged and staffed the Light Lunches that have become a popular feature in the Hall's

calendar are, after years of devoted service, stepping down. The Village Hall Trust is keen to maintain the tradition if we can – but we will need help, our own team of volunteers is already quite stretched and we simply can't just add this to our "events calendar". We need help, and that help needs to be volunteers who are happy to join a rota to support continued provision of these lunches – not to take on a role requiring you to be there every time – just to be part of a team that shares the job over the year. We are very grateful for offers of support from the WI but we need more – please think about it, the lunches are very popular, serve people who often don't get many opportunities for a chat and would be a real loss to the village. Other items which are on the current to do list include: landscaping of the garden area outside Nepcote hall – which is not a trivial job because of the builder's rubble under the surface; improving the heating system by linking the controllers to the booking system; and, maybe, linking the door locks and parking barrier locks to the booking system. Clearly, some of this, especially the last one is dependent on funding and value so we shall have to see how the discussions with potential suppliers develops.

Volunteers needed for Light Lunch in 2025

Light Lunch @1 is a lunch club which meets at Findon Village Hall on a monthly basis, currently on the last Tuesday of the month, except in August and December. Light Lunch was started in September 2014 and so has been running for 10 years, interrupted only by the closure of the village hall during the covid pandemic in 2020.

It is run by Dorothy Barber with a group of about 12 volunteers and is attended by between 30 – 40 people, mainly residents of Findon village but Dorothy has decided not to continue after this year and so currently the last lunch club will be held in November 2024.

Findon Village Hall Trust committee is currently exploring whether we can facilitate the lunch club continuing to run in 2025 as a service for village residents. If you are interested in being involved please get in touch with us.

We will need people interested in cooking for the lunch, putting out and

laying up tables, taking the money and running the raffle, taking orders and serving up the food and helping to clear up at the end of the session.

Once we have heard from potential volunteers we plan to hold a meeting to discuss how we can run the lunch club from next year with everyone interested in helping out. Ideally we would like to recruit enough volunteers to operate a rota across the 10 sessions so responsibility is shared between a number of people.

Norleen shared some of her recent experiences of staging emergency situations, including one at Heathrow Airport where they had to simulate a terrorist attack. Members are all volunteers who must go through a year's training in acting out different injuries and medical conditions, such as a heart attack, and cosmetics to make the injuries look as realistic as possible. Norleen was joined by Helen Harries who applied make up and silicone to her legs to show burns and a shrapnel wound. It was a little gory but fascinating to see how life like the injuries appeared.

Our next meeting is on Thursday 9th May 2024 at 7.30pm. We will be looking at this year's National Federation of WI Resolution: Dental Health Matters. The NFWI is calling on government to increase investment in the training and

Findon Parish Council News

I do hope you have all managed to have a look at the pond on Nepcote Green and as the weather starts to turn more spring like, then the wildflowers will soon start to appear. Just to explain, fencing has been put around the pond to protect both the pond and also to stop any people and/or animals from going any further. It is a requirement that notice is given that in the middle of the pond, the water is at its deepest.

I attach a photo with a charming spring arrangement of flowers which is somewhere in the village. My thanks go to Sian Keating for her artistic flair. You can find this along the High Street so I will leave you to find it. As the saying goes, seek and ye shall find.

Just a note to remind residents if you are considering carrying out any works at your property, i.e. rooms in the roof; renovation work if you have a listed building; extensions to your property, tree work where the tree is protected by a Tree Preservation Order or a change of use, you will need to apply for consent from South Downs National Park Authority. There is a range of information regarding planning on the SDNPA website (www.southdowns.gov.uk) or speak to one of the Planning Officers for advice.

The Parish Council hold monthly Planning Committee meetings which are made up of all councillors and chaired by the Chairman of Planning who is currently Cllr Sean Smith. We take into account whether the applications comply with our Neighbourhood Development Plan policies and take account of any representations made by neighbours. This information is submitted to the SDNPA who will make the final decision on whether to grant consent or not ([Simple Search \(southdowns.gov.uk\)](http://Simple Search (southdowns.gov.uk))). The Parish Council does not have the final decision as we are statutory consultees, not the decision makers.

It follows the 'social round' of Maybelline who records which dresses she wears for each event in her 'dressing book' - and the men she encounters while wearing them. The play opens a window on the way clothes were – and still are - a means by which men could control the separated public and private worlds of women. Has anything changed? Through a process of 'magic realism' the action changes to

the 1960's and Maybelline's clothes, which had been her prison, now set her free.



Paws Animal Sanctuary

We had crazy weather yesterday I could hear it was pouring with rain when I was still in bed, but it had stopped by the time I got up and went out and let the chickens out. The sun came out and all the chickens came out on to the lawn, they lay on their sides lifting their wings to sunbathe. Chickens hate the rain and they never get wet if they can help it, but within ten minutes, even though the sun was out, it started to rain. All the chickens broke the speed limit running back undercover in the chicken run. The weather continued doing this all day -really heavy rain then sunshine, then out and the chickens would come out again. Then having to shelter again and again.

Our donkey also hates getting wet. He trots into the field shelter or stable with the first drop of rain and you only see his nose until the rain stops. The pony ignores the rain and just carries on grazing.

We have a large fishpond and are lucky to have any fish left, the seagulls dive and steal the fish, even in front of you. I spent the morning fixing interlocking plastic floating mesh panels. After unsuccessfully trying netting, we have a bridge over the pond that usually protects the fish from the two herons, but seagulls bring other seagulls and they damaged the netting!

We have even more stray cats - people keep moving leaving their cats behind. The last three boys we trapped all needed neutering, flea treatment, worming, microchipping and

inoculations. They each need their second inoculations before they leave, but all three are reserved. Another two were rehomed this week, and a Guinea Pig came in to find a friend after her own companion died. We took days trying with lots of different girls but she was bullying them, eventually we gave her a neutered boy. He sauntered over and tried his luck and got a very angry response, she put him in his place, he now does as he is told, and they are now living quite happily together - she is the boss.

This year I have been accident prone, caused by wearing trainers, I now wear Ugg Boots, I hate wellies. One evening I bent down to pick up an old poorly hen and slipped on the wet grass. I fell over sideways but couldn't save myself because I had my hands out in front holding the hen, breaking my hip joint and fractured my pelvis. After a spell in Worthing Hospital (where the food was unexpectedly really good). I was on crutches. A few weeks later I had another fall on the concrete and broke my wrist and hit my chin on a step having to have it stitched because it wouldn't stop bleeding. When I fell I broke a tooth in my jaw. I had weeks with toothache, I found a dentist and had my tooth out last week. When I fell, I was wearing trainers again! When I paid the dentist it cost £240.

A friend recently rescued two 10 year old dogs, too old to be insured, she took them to register with a local vet, who said they need dental work and
