Collect for the Third Sunday of Lent



Eternal God, give us insight to discern your will for us, to give up what harms us, and to seek the perfection we are promised in Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen**

Bible reading: Luke 13: 1-9

At that very time there were some present who told him about the Galileans whose blood Pilate had mingled with their sacrifices. He asked them, "Do you think that because these Galileans suffered in this way they were worse sinners than all other Galileans? No, I tell you; but unless you repent, you will all perish as they did. Or those eighteen who were killed when the tower of Siloam fell on them—do you think that they were worse offenders than all the others living in Jerusalem? No, I tell you; but unless you repent, you will all perish just as they did."

Then he told this parable: "A man had a fig tree planted in his vineyard; and he came looking for fruit on it and found none. So he said to the gardener, 'See here! For three years I have come looking for fruit on this fig tree, and still I find none. Cut it down! Why should it be wasting the soil?' He replied, 'Sir, let it alone for one more year, until I dig around it and put manure on it. If it bears fruit next year, well and good; but if not, you can cut it down.'"

Reflection on the Reading:

The fig tree is highly symbolic for the people of Israel. Many times in the Old Testament it is used to signify a life of peace and prosperity, with the image of someone sitting under his own vine and fig tree. The fig tree is also a symbol of the covenant between God and Israel.

Fig trees are valuable because they crop twice a year, taking three years to establish and fruit.

The parable told by Jesus today is about being given a second chance. The landowner, frustrated at the lack of fruit, would dig the tree out and replant but the gardener urges one more year, with extra care. You and I are like the tree, along with all who do not repent and turn back to Jesus, the gardener; when we do, we too will bear fruit.
